

Household Waste Collection

The SWM Rules , 2016 require all gated communities with more than 5000 sq m area to ensure (1) waste segregation at source and (2) collection in separate streams.

As an aware and sensitive community that has led on many fronts, Nirvana Country aims for 100 % compliance with the Solid Waste Management Rules 2016.

All homes must keep out only segregated waste for collection by Housekeeping staff. They must

1. Place Kitchen Waste in Green bin, Dry recyclable waste (paper, plastic , metal etc) in another bin or a large bag, and Reject waste in Red bin .
2. Place horticulture waste by the side of the bins, and if there are only leaves, place them in another bin . Do not mix with kitchen waste.
3. Deposit e-waste in the E waste bins placed in the Community Ground, specially when bulbs and tubes are replaced at home.
4. Deposit broken glass in the designated area in the Community Ground when a collection drive is announced.

Mixed waste will be not picked up by Housekeeping staff and the resident will have to drop off mixed waste at the Nirvana Waste Transfer Point near the Nirvana Main Entry Gate.

Waste Segregation Guidelines

Nirvana Country

Avoid using any lining for waste bins. Wash them with plain water. Prevent plastic from going to landfills.



1. Organic/Wet

Goes for composting. Use GREEN bin. Avoid newspapers for lining the bin. Ink is toxic for compost.

Kitchen Waste

Vegetable / fruit peels
Egg, walnut & almond shells
Meat / fish bones
Stale fruits / vegetables
Tea bags / coffee grinds
Leaf / patta plates
Cooked food / Leftovers
(remove all water/gravy)



Garden Waste

Fallen leaves / twigs
All garden trimmings /
puja flowers / garlands / havan
samagree



4. E-waste

(Periodic collection drives - given/
sold to CPCB authorized e-waste
collection or recycling agencies)
All bulbs, tubelights & LED
lights can be left anytime in the
e-waste dropbox kept outside
the RWA office.

All broken down small and large
electrical & electronic items
like wires, cables, connectors,
chargers, broken calculators,
mixies, etc. can be stored and
given away during collection
drives. Batteries are also given to
the Ewaste collectors.



2. Dry Recyclables

Goes to recyclers / kabaadiwalas.
Do not put inside green or red
bins. Keep SEPARATELY in a bag,
bin or carton.

Plastic

(Must be rinsed if soiled)

Plastic covers / packets / bags /
wrappers / bottles + caps / boxes
+ lids / cups / toys / products
/ milk & curd packets / floss /
toothpaste / bubble wrap



Paper

Newspaper / magazines
stationery / junk mail /
cardboard cartons / pizza boxes /
packaging / tetrapaks / tags



Metal

Tin boxes / covers / wires / pipes
metal cans / toys / aluminium
foil / medicine foils / metal nails



Other Dry Waste

Rubber items / Thermocol /
styrofoam / old mops / duster
/ sponges / wooden chips /
coconut shells / wooden chips



5. Glass

Keep Glass separate. Deposit in the
community ground when collection is
announced. Unbroken and broken
glass / bottles / crockery

Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016

Duties of waste generators:

(1) Every waste generator shall
a) segregate and store the waste generated by them
in three separate streams namely bio-degradable, non
biodegradable and domestic hazardous wastes in suitable
bins and handover segregated wastes to authorised
waste pickers or waste collectors as per the direction or
notification by the local authorities from time to time.



3. Non Recyclable Rejects

Goes to the landfill. Use RED bin.

Sanitary/Hazardous Waste

(Use a newspaper for wrapping)

Used single-use disposables,
diapers, sanitary napkins,
bandages, condoms, tissues
or anything with body fluids,
waxing strips, hair, swept dust,
polypropylene bags



Kitchen, drain, toilet, glass
& home cleaners. Cosmetics,
perfumes, deodorants. Moth balls
& air fresheners. Ant & cockroach
sprays, rat baits. Wood, shoe &
nail polish, nail polish remover. Oil
& all kinds of paints & thinners.
Turpentine containers

Sharps (small quantities only;
wrap in newspaper and hand over to
waste picker so they don't get hurt)

Razors / blades, used syringes,
injection vials



6. Expired Medicines

(Store & keep separate)

Cycotoxics, glass thermometers &
expired medicines will be sent for
incineration every 6 months.

7. Construction & Demolition (C&D)

(To be coordinated with MCG)

Concrete rubble / construction
waste / cement / bricks
broken flower pots / ceramics
